

WELCOME TO UNC CHARLOTTE

We hope you enjoy this self-guided walking tour, which offers a general overview of our beautiful, modern campus. We invite you to stop at any building, classroom, residence hall or campus dining area, even those not directly on the walking tour path. If you are visiting on a typical class day, you will get a better idea of student and campus life.

DAILY CAMPUS TOURS

- » Student-guided daily campus tours are available Monday through Friday and select Saturdays with an advance reservation on our website.

BEGINNING YOUR SELF-GUIDED TOUR

- » This walking tour has been designed to take approximately one hour.
- » Start your tour at the Gage Undergraduate Admissions Center and follow the numbered stops.
- » Return back to the Gage Undergraduate Admissions Center using the Gold Niner Transit Bus Stop #34 across from the Light Rail station.
- » On your way out, we encourage you to drive along the perimeter of campus to see additional residence halls, academic buildings and the football stadium.

OUR HISTORY

- » UNC Charlotte is one of a generation of universities founded in metropolitan areas of the United States immediately after World War II in response to rising education demands generated by the war.
- » Originally started in 1946 as an evening college center named The Charlotte Center, the institution later evolved into Charlotte College in 1949, offering the first two years of college courses.
- » In 1961, Charlotte College moved its growing student body into two new buildings on what became our current 1,000-acre campus.
- » In 1965, the NC legislature approved bills making Charlotte College a four-year, state-supported college, creating the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. UNC Charlotte remains one of the fastest growing universities in the UNC System.

GETTING AROUND CAMPUS

Most students walk, bike or skateboard to class, but Charlotte also offers a variety of quick transportation across campus.

- » Charlotte's Niner Transit buses are free of charge and operate every day, except when the University is closed. Download the Passio Go app or visit passiogo.com.
- » Lime provides affordable, short-term bike and e-scooter rentals on campus.

CAMPUS SAFETY

- » UNC Charlotte Police & Public Safety is a fully authorized state police agency, providing 24/7 police and security service to the campus.
- » Blue Light emergency phones are placed strategically throughout campus providing the student community with an easy, reliable way to report a crime.
- The LiveSafe App provides access to campus emergency resources and a direct line of communication with students and the police via text and phone services.

NEW ADDITIONS

Charlotte's growing student population also brings exciting additions to our campus

WILSON HALL

The new six-story, 147,000 square foot residence hall completes the upper South Village residential quad and provides a direct pathway to SoVi Dining Hall. The new hall helps new students find their home at Charlotte while they navigate their academic courses. The building's design includes traditional double rooms for up to 692 residents and their Resident Advisors.

THE 49TH ACRE

The three-acre site includes a lawn area for student tailgating and a pavilion for events. In addition to tailgating, the venue will provide year-round opportunities for organized and informal student gatherings and recreation.

- » Housing & Residence Life: An administrative offices for on-campus living



3 ROBINSON HALL, STORRS & ROWE

- » Robinson: Performing arts, dance, music and theatre
- » Storrs: College of Arts + Architecture studios and classrooms
- » Rowe: Art department, art galleries with rotating exhibits, sculpture courtyard, choral rehearsal hall, instrumental studio, photography labs and art studios



J. MURREY ATKINS LIBRARY

- » Open 24 hours Sunday-Thursday, with varying hours on Friday ad Saturday and 24/7 during exam weeks.
- » Home to a multitude of resources including computer workstations, lending laptops, private group study rooms, electronic journals and journal databases
- » Starbucks is located on the ground floor
- » Research librarians are on site to assist students




5 KING, REESE & CONE UNIVERSITY CENTER

- » King & Reese: Offices including the graduate school, Human Resources, Student Employment, Financial Aid and the Dean of Students
- » Cone University Center: Named after Bonnie Cone, the founder of UNC Charlotte, and contains Subway, Panda Express and The Market at Cone featuring Whitney's Bakery
- » Niner Central: Central resource for services related to financial aid, billing, registration and transcripts



BARNHARDT STUDENT ACTIVITY CENTER, GOLDEN NUGGET & STAR QUAD

- » Barnhardt Student Activity Center (SAC): 9,000-seat Halton Arena, home to 49er basketball and volleyball
- » Golden Nugget: Rub the Golden Nugget outside the student entrance of the SAC for good luck
- » Star Quad: Compass-shaped mosaic design on the ground that is a popular spot for outdoor events and activities like the annual National Pan-Hellenic Council Yard Show during fall Gold Rush



CHHS/COED PLAZA, WOODWARD, COED & CHHS

- » CHHS/COED Plaza: Throw a penny in the Norm Statue's pan for good
- » Woodward: Home to the College of Computing & Informatics
- » Cato College of Education (COED): Home to education, foreign language, culture studies and counseling
- » College of Health & Human Services (CHHS): Home to nursing, public health, social work, exercise science and health systems management



(B) UNIVERSITY RECREATION **CENTER (UREC)**

- » 48,000 square foot building dedicated to student recreation and fitness
- » Features indoor pool, outdoor pool, multi-purpose courts, group fitness studios, cycling studio, elevated running/walking track, cardio and strength training equipment and a demo kitchen

- » Ranked as one of the top college unions in the nation!
- » Features University bookstore, movie theater, food court, Social 704 dining hall, hair salon, NinerTech store, student ID office, student activities offices and group meeting spaces

- » Lynch Hall: First-year student residence hall featuring suite-style living and home to many Learning Communities
