

LIVE ON. Living on campus helps you build your foundation for success at UNC Charlotte. National research indicates that living on campus contributes to greater overall satisfaction with and success in college. Our own research shows these national trends hold true at UNC Charlotte. Students who live on campus are more likely to graduate on time (in 4 years) than their off-campus peers. Students who live on campus are more likely to get involved in extracurricular activities and learn valuable educational, social and leadership skills. On campus housing eliminates most of the inconveniences and distractions associated with living off campus so students can concentrate on academics. HALL TOURS

HOW TO APPLY

Once you have been admitted, visit housing.charlotte. edu to complete the online application. We begin accepting applications in November and will continue to accept them as long as space is available. A \$100 non-refundable housing application fee is required and does not guarantee a housing assignment.

HALL STAFF

Resident Advisors (RA) are specially selected and trained upper-level students who live on your floor in your building. They facilitate a sense of community by helping residents meet one another, planning activities, ensuring that community standards are followed and serving as a resource for students as they navigate university life. RAs are selected for their leadership potential, interpersonal abilities, positive, caring attitudes and sense of commitment. RAs are students' primary resource for campus information and assistance.

Graduate Hall Advisor (GHA) are students in UNC Charlotte graduate degree programs who help to supervise the RAs, facilitate events and activities, assist students with concerns and participate in the overall community operations.

Residence Education Coordinators (REC) are fulltime professional staff members who live in the residence communities and are responsible for the educational and operational functions of the living area. They oversee the community, supervise the staff, administer departmental and university policy and assist students with concerns. RECs have advanced degrees and significant experience working with college students.

ASSIGNMENTS

Living on campus at UNC Charlotte is very popular and demand is high. To support the success of incoming students, we will prioritize applications from entering first time in college (FTIC) students, new transfer and international students, then continuing students as available space allows.

While most students begin their Charlotte journey living on campus, it's important to approach this experience with a four-year plan in mind. Consider your housing options moving forward, as the majority of non-first-year students will need to live off-campus during their college career.



SAFETY & SECURITY

The safety and security of our residential students is of utmost importance. That's why we keep our buildings locked 24/7, and access is restricted to residents of the building. In addition, extra security is provided by professional staff who live in each hall, security guards, security cameras and our own police department on campus. UNC Charlotte also offers LiveSafe, a "mobile blue light phone" app that will help students in distress, send emergency alerts and allow students to anonymously report tips.

SUPPORT

Trained residence hall and facilities staff are available around-the-clock to respond to any situations that may arise. Live-in staff members provide a web of support for students in a variety of ways including fostering community, assisting with conflict resolution, and helping to maintain a safe living environment. Members of our main office team provide support through housing assignments and processes that address individualized needs like housing accommodations and gender affirming housing. This support has proven invaluable as students transition to campus and work to integrate themselves in the UNC Charlotte community.

AROUND YOUR BUILDING

Living on campus puts you within walking distance of your classes, labs, libraries, theaters, concerts, art galleries and sports facilities. You will save hours weekly by living on campus - time used to your academic and social advantage.

CAMPUS TRANSPORTATION & PARKING

It is not necessary to have a car at UNC Charlotte. A free Campus Shuttle runs on campus every day (except when the University is closed). In addition, students have access to the LYNX Blue Line light rail which connects campus to Uptown Charlotte and a bike and scooter share program. Parking is available for students living on campus who choose to bring their vehicle to school. A permit is required to park anytime the University is open. Parking information is available at pats.charlotte.edu.

DINING & MEAL PLANS

You are never far from a UNC Charlotte Dining Services facility when you live on campus, with two all-youcare-to-eat facilities, twenty retail restaurants and two convenience stores. All first-year students and residents in traditional spaces and suites are required to purchase a meal plan, which is not included in the price of housing. Upperclassmen in apartments and in Greek Village are not required to purchase a meal plan. For more information visit aux.charlotte.edu/meal-plans.

ROOM RATES


Room and board rates vary based on the selected residence hall and meal plan. Please visit housing. charlotte.edu for details. Rates are all-inclusive and consist of rent, utilities, cable, laundry and high-speed wired and wireless internet. Meal plans are billed separately from housing.

BILL MANAGEMENT

When you live on campus, you will find competitive prices for housing and meals without the hassle of utility bills, first/last month's rent or having to sublet your apartment over the summer. All of your bills, for each semester, are included in a single fee charged to your student account. There are no surprise expenses and no chasing down roommates for their part of the rent. Payment plans are available through Niner Central.

UNIVERSITY RECREATION

The University Recreation Center, UREC, which opened in Spring of 2020! The 148,000 sq. ft. facility features an indoor pool, outdoor pool, multi-purpose courts, group fitness studios, cycling studio, elevated running/walking track, and multi-floor cardio and strength training equipment. Located beside the Popp Martin Student Union, UREC is a short walk/bus ride from our residence halls!


