Additional Requirements / Special Note for Admission to the upper division in major:	<p>Transfer students meeting general admission requirements will begin at UNC Charlotte as Social Work Lower Division students until they qualify for the upper-division. Students will apply to the upper-division once eligible to do so, however the upper-division is competitive. Upper-division minimum admission criteria: (1) Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit) with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5; (2) Complete an AA/AS degree prior to transferring to earn General Education exemption or complete all LBST courses, writing intensive course, as well as their elective and specific population courses as required by the department; (3) Complete progression courses at a NC Community College or UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course.</p> <p>SOWK 1101 is also required to declare the Upper Division program. SOWK 1101 can be taken in summer at UNC Charlotte or the community college equivalent is HSE 110. HSE 110 does not satisfy an AA requirement, please talk to your community college academic advisor</p>
