Additional Requirements / Special Note for Admission to the upper division in major:	Admission to upper division requires a 2.7 or higher GPA, grades of C or better in EDU 216 (EDUC 1511) and EDU 221 (SPED 2100), a passing score on the Praxis Core (or exempting SAT/ACT scores), and acceptable results on a background check (run at the time of application to the major).
