

North Carolina Community College Transfer Guide into the College of Health & Human Services

Transfer Students completing AA or AS Degrees: Students with a completed AA/AS degree will receive a General Education exemption for the Liberal Studies sequence; however, this exemption does not cover all General Education requirements. Some CHHS majors may require additional Math and Science coursework beyond what is required within AA/AS degrees. Incorporate suggested courses below into AA/AS degrees for the most seamless transfer.

Prospective Public Health Sciences Majors:

Transfer students meeting general transfer admissions requirements will begin at UNC Charlotte as Pre-Public Health students until they qualify for the upper-division. Students will apply to the upper-division once eligible to do so, however the upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Students will apply to the upper division once meeting the requirements below:

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit)
- Students must earn at least a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College or UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:

- Best for students to transfer for in Spring or Summer 1 term in order to complete prerequisite courses prior to upper-division starting in Fall.
- Most HLTH Prerequisite courses can be taken at UNC Charlotte in summer semesters
- Upper-Division applications are reviewed in early February- students planning to apply to the upper-division at the same time as transferring, should contact the CHHS Advising Center.

Prospective Health Systems Management Majors:

Transfer students must meet general transfer admissions requirements to be admissible to this major. To progress in the Health Systems Management major, students must first:

- Attain 2.0 or higher GPA in all college courses
- Successfully complete HSMT 2101 & HSMT 2103 with grade C or better (students must have sophomore standing/30+ credit hours to take these 2 courses at UNC Charlotte).

Prospective Exercise Science Majors

Transfer students meeting general transfer admissions requirements will begin at UNC Charlotte as Pre-Kinesiology students until they qualify for the upper-division. Students will apply to the upper-division once eligible to do so, however the upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Students will apply to the upper division once meeting the requirements below

- Complete 36 credit hours with a minimum of GPA of 2.5
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College or UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:

- Most KNES prerequisite courses can be completed at UNC Charlotte during summer semesters
- A complete upper-division application includes: written personal statement, Dean of Students Conduct Check, and completed application forms
- Upper-division admits students in Fall and Spring semesters

Prospective Social Work Majors:

Transfer students meeting general transfer admissions requirements will begin at UNC Charlotte as Pre-Social Work students until they qualify for the upper-division. Students will apply to the upper-division once eligible to do so, however the upper division is competitive and not all who apply can be accommodated. Students will apply to the upper division once meeting the requirements below:

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit) with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
- Complete an AA/AS degree prior to transferring to earn General Education exemption Or complete all LBST courses, writing intensive course, as well as other elective and specific population courses as required by the department
- Complete the following progression courses at a NC Community College **or** UNC Charlotte with a minimum grade of C in each course:

- Upper-Division applications reviewed on a rolling basis between Feb. 1st and July 1st
- A complete upper-division application includes: written essay, resume, paid/volunteer experience, and completed
