

North Carolina Community College Transfer Guide into the College of Health and Human Services:

Nursing Programs

All students must complete University general education requirements in addition to the following supplementary courses. General education guidelines and course equivalencies are available in the Undergraduate Admissions office.

<u>Degrees offered:</u> Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Pre-Licensure BSN)

Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN/BSN Completion Program)

Prospective BSN Pre-Licensure Nursing Majors:

Students seeking admission to the Nursing program will be classified as pre-nursing majors until they are admitted to the upper division major. In order to qualify for an upper division major, students must:

- Attain junior standing (complete 60 semester hours of credit)
- Complete the following progression courses as well as all UNC Charlotte general education requirements. All prerequisite science and NURS courses <u>must</u> be completed with a B or better (see retake policy below).
- Have at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA

Transfer students who have not yet completed all of the nursing prerequisites may be admitted to UNC Charlotte as pre-nursing. Admission to pre-nursing does not automatically admit an applicant into the nursing major (upper division). An additional application to the School of Nursing is necessary once requirements above are met and all prerequisite courses below are complete. Admission decisions into upper division are made by the School of Nursing for Fall and Spring semesters. Please see nursing uncc.edu for the application to upper division. Students must be listed on the North Carolina Nurse Aide Registry before starting upper division courses.

^{*}Students transferring to UNC Charlotte prior to completing Microbiology at another institution should note that Principles of Biology(BIO 110 or BIO 111) is the prerequisite for Microbiology at UNC Charlotte.

Special Note-Retake Policy: Within the prerequisite courses requiring a "B" or higher, students may earn only one grade of a C or below which they will be required to retake for a grade B or higher before applying to upper division. Students should note that 4 credit hour science courses at any community college transfer as 2 separate classes (class and lab). If a student earns a C in a 4 credit hour science prerequisite course at the community college, that C will transfer as 2 grades of C, making a student ineligible for the upper division of the Nursing program.

Prospective RN/BSN Completion Majors:

Registered nurses seeking admission to the curriculum that need to complete additional nursing prerequisites and/or general education courses may apply for admission to the Pre-RN/BSN completion program. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. Admission the Pre-RN/BSN does not guarantee admission to the RN/BSN completion curriculum. Students complete 2 applications (Undergraduate Admissions & School of Nursing) and must meet the requirements below:

- Hold a current unencumbered license as a Registered Nurse
- Hold a minimum GPA of 2.0 or better in all transferable college coursework
- Complete all required nursing prerequisites with a minimum grade of "C"
- Complete all prerequisites and general education by the end of the semester prior to the start of the RN/BSN completionprogram.
- Additional consideration is given to students with a previous bachelor's or master's degree, previous UNC Charlotte course credit, and current work experience as a registered nurse.
- Transfer applicants to the RN/BSN completion program must have a completed application on file in the UndergraduateAdmissions Office to be considered for admission to upper division.

<u>Application Process:</u> Students who have all course requirements above complete and meet all School of Nursing requirements indicated will need to apply to UNC Charlotte through the Office of Undergraduate Admissions and complete a separate School of Nursing application simultaneously. The School of Nursing application deadlines are earlier than university application deadlines-students should plan to apply early to ensure consideration.

Recommended process for potential UNC Charlotte students:

- 1. Email cgavin2@uncc.edu copy of transcripts (unofficial accepted) to evaluate previous course work and plan of study start date.
- 2. Complete UNC Charlotte School of Nursing RN-to-B.S.N. Completion Program application by appropriate deadline below.
- 3. Prior to enrolling in RN-to-B.S.N. program courses all students must have the following: Current unencumbered license to practice as a RN in the United States, Liability insurance, Meet University Immunization and Health Requirements, Cumulative GPA of 2.0 or greater in AAS degree coursework.
- 4. Complete UNC Charlotte transfer student undergraduate application.
