COMPLETE ONE ITEM FROM THE LIST BELOW TO SHOW PROOF OF ENGLISH PROFICIENCY (NOT REQUIRED IF APPLYING FOR CONDITIONAL ADMISSION THROUGH ELTI)

- **TOEFL IBT:** 70 or higher (minimum of 14 in each sub score)
TOEFL DISCOUNT CODE: UNCCCharlotte40 at checkout when registering /paying for test
- **IELTS:** 6.0 or higher (minimum of 5.0 in each sub score)
- **Duolingo English Test (EDT):** 105 or higher
- **PTE Academic:** 48 or higher (minimum of 35 in each sub score)
- **SAT:** 500 on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing
- **ACT:** 19 on the Reading section
- **English Language and Training Institute (ELTI)
at UNC Charlotte:** Completion of Level 5
- **U.S. High School Diploma:** Transcripts showing successful completion of two years

OFFICIAL COURSE-BY-COURSE CREDENTIAL EVALUATION

- **Foreign High School:** The University does not evaluate foreign high school transcripts. Instead, an official course-by-course credential evaluation must be provided from a NACES-accredited agency (naces.org/members). Please send your official foreign transcripts to any appropriate agency. Once the review is completed, they will submit the credential evaluation report on your behalf directly to our office. We recommend using International Education Evaluations ([IEE discount here](#)), Educational Perspectives, Educational Credential Evaluators or SpanTran for the evaluation.
- **U.S. High School:** Submit an official high school transcript. You do not need a credential evaluation for U.S. schools.
- **Please note:** Students who did not complete all four years of high school in the U.S. and the grades weren't transferred to their US transcript, must submit a credential evaluation for the years completed outside of the U.S. An evaluation must be completed by any NACES-accredited agency.

ONE ESSAY IS REQUIRED

TEST SCORES

Scores for English Proficiency are valid for two years.

They must be sent electronically directly from test centers to UNC Charlotte.

FOREIGN HIGH SCHOOL DOCUMENTS / CREDENTIAL EVALUATION

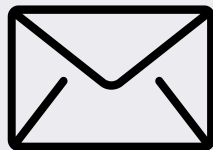
Foreign academic documents are not evaluated by the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.

Request a course-by-course credential evaluation to be submitted by any NACES accredited agency: naces.org/members.

We recommend using IEE, Educational Perspectives, SpanTran or ECE. Evaluation may be sent electronically, by mail directly from the agency or hand delivered in a closed, sealed envelope.

U.S. HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT

- Request for your school to mail transcripts directly to UNC Charlotte.
- Hand delivery of a transcript in a closed sealed envelope to the Gage Undergraduate Admissions Center at UNC Charlotte.
- Use your school's electronic delivery systems (ex: Common App, National Student ClearingHouse or Parchment) to submit an official electronic transcript to admissions@charlotte.edu.

U.S. CITIZENS AND PERMANENT RESIDENTS are welcome to apply for University scholarships and financial aid. Students on a visa are encouraged to look for external scholarships and sponsorships. IF YOU LIVE IN NORTH CAROLINA AND YOU ARE A U.S. CITIZEN, permanent resident, refugee or a student on a status other than F-1, J or B visa's, you might be eligible for in-state tuition. You can verify your eligibility through North Carolina Residency Determination Service at ncresidency.org.

It is recommended that international students live on campus, but it is not required.

INTERNATIONAL FIRST-YEAR STUDENT NEXT STEPS AFTER ADMISSION



1. LOG IN TO YOUR FUTURE 49ER PORTAL

future49er.charlotte.edu/status

- Review your acceptance letter.
- Confirm you are coming to UNC Charlotte by submitting your Intent to Enroll.

2. ACTIVATE YOUR NINERNET ACCOUNT

ninernet.charlotte.edu

(Note: your NinerNET Account is your student account.)

- Go to ninernet.charlotte.edu, click on the "Activate Account" button and follow the instructions. Your NinerNET username can be found in your admission acceptance letter.

3. RECEIVE YOUR I-20 IF YOU PLAN TO STUDY ON AN F-1 INTERNATIONAL STUDENT VISA

- The International Student and Scholars' Office (ISSO) will email your Financial Certification Form (FCF) within 2 weeks of your acceptance. To receive an I-20 please submit this form along with your financial records (scholarship letter, sponsorship letter, bank statement, etc.) demonstrating your capacity to pay the total cost of attendance. If you are transferring from another U.S. institution, you will be asked to complete the SEVIS transfer form as well.

4. APPLY FOR HOUSING AND PAY YOUR HOUSING DEPOSIT IF YOU PLAN TO LIVE ON CAMPUS

5. PLAN YOUR TRIP

- Apply for the student visa if needed. If traveling from abroad, we recommend Charlotte Douglas International Airport (CLT), which is about a 20-minute drive from UNC Charlotte's campus. If you are an F-1 visa student, you can enter the U.S. up to 30 days before the program start date (the date listed on your I-20) and no later than the program start date.

6. SUBMIT YOUR FINAL/UPDATED CREDENTIAL EVALUATIONS AND NECESSARY TEST SCORES TO UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS

7. MAKE YOUR NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION RESERVATION IN YOUR FUTURE 49ER PORTAL

- All new incoming students are required to complete their New Student Modules online and attend orientation prior to the beginning of their classes. During NSO, you will learn about University resources, connect with other incoming students, be introduced to academics at Charlotte and more.

8. ATTEND INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ORIENTATION FOR STUDENTS ON AN F-1 VISA

- This is a free event hosted by ISSO. No registration is needed. If you are a student on an F-1 visa, you are required to attend.

9. MATH PLACEMENT

clas-math.charlotte.edu/math-placement

- Prior to registering for math courses, students are required to take the Math Placement Assessment. You are encouraged to complete it prior to New Student Orientation to register for the correct level of Math.
- Students who submit SAT or ACT or have transferable credits for the college math class, do not need to take the Math Placement Assessment.

10. PROVIDE YOUR IMMUNIZATION RECORDS AND SHOW PROOF OF HEALTH INSURANCE OR ENROLL IN THE UNIVERSITY-SPONSORED HEALTH INSURANCE PLAN

11. PLAN YOUR FINANCES AND BILL PAYMENTS

- After you register for classes, you will be required to pay your bill prior to each semester of your studies.
- You will see the bill in your NinerNET account. There is also an option to enroll in the UNC Charlotte payment plan and divide charges into smaller payments. Check your Charlotte email regularly and keep track of the deadlines.
