If you are transferring with less than 24 semester credit hours, then official high school documentation may be required. If you completed your high school education outside the US, then an official course-by-course credential evaluation would be required from a NACES-accredited agency. Otherwise, official transcripts will suffice for US high schools.

Please note, second-degree applicants (already have a bachelor's degree) are not required to submit high school documentation.

Once we receive all required documents, the review process takes **approximately 6 to 8 weeks**. Processing times vary throughout the year with priority given to applications for the nearest term. Students who live abroad should apply to the university well before the deadline to ensure arrival to the campus prior to the beginning of the term.

High school documents

If transferring with less than 24 hours of credit

- Foreign high school: Submit high school credential evaluation through any NACES accredited agency at naces.org/members. We recommend using IEE, Educational Perspectives, SpanTranor ECE.
- U.S. high school: Official transcripts may be provided directly from the high school through either mail, email or electronic delivery system. You may also drop off a transcript in a closed sealed envelope at Gage Undergraduate Admissions Center at UNC Charlotte.

Foreign college or university transcript

Foreign university documents are not processed by UNC Charlotte. Request a course-by-course credential evaluation to be submitted by any NACES accredited agency, listed at naces.org/members. We recommend using IEE, Educational Perspectives, SpanTran or ECE. Request for your school to mail transcripts directly to UNC Charlotte.

ESTIMATED COST OF ATTENDANCE

Tuition rates are based on the 2024-2025 academic year (two semesters) and 12+ credit hours. They are subject to change for 2025-2026 and/or pending legislative approval. If you are transferring from another U.S. institution, you will also be asked to complete the SEVIS transfer form.

	Plan your trip
	Apply for the student visa if needed. If traveling from abroad, we recommend Charlotte Douglas International Airport (CLT), which is about a 20-minute drive from UNC Charlotte's campus. If you are an F-1 visa student, you can enter the U.S. up to 30 days before the program start date (the date listed

on your I-20) and no later than the program start date.

If you are a student on an F-1 visa, you are required to attend. We encourage you to complete it prior to New Student Orientation to register for the correct level of math. Students who submit SAT or ACT scores or have transferable credits for the college math class do not need to take the Math Placement Assessment.
